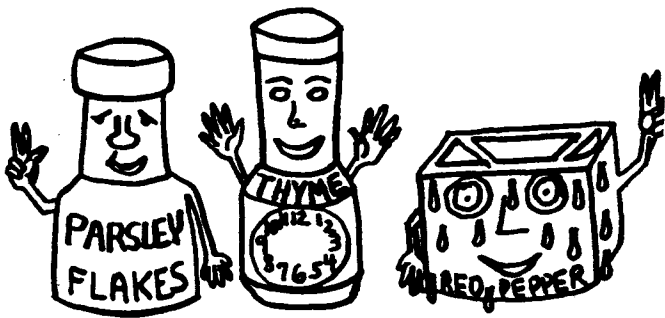
STAFF SIDE

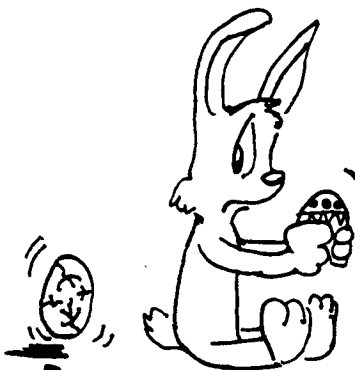


One day when the Easter Bunny was getting his eggs ready, he saw a cracked egg and said,

**WILD LIFE**: An anthology title, full of funny-animal comics. Contains greats feature like John Nunnemacher's "Buffalo Wings" and Joe Rosales's "Wildlifers", and lousy features like "Jaxx the Lion" and "The Sophistikats". All in all, a great publication. **SIMPSONS COMICS**: Almost as good as the show! Plus, this summer, Simpsons Comics will also feature "Roswell", a hilarious sci-fi comic. Available wherever comics are sold.

**AKIKO**, by Mark Crilley: Comics are often thought to be a male oriented industry, but this is a comic I think girls would especially enjoy. A charming fairy tale about a little girl from Japan. Available by direct order at Eau Claire Comics, or from: Comic Therapy, P.O. Box 1309 Andover NJ 07821.

**NINJA HIGH SCHOOL**, created by Ben Dunn. Violent, and at times a bit off-color, but hilarious, this is one of the few truly good Manga comics. Fans are often given the opportunity to contribute stories to the annual specials. Available from Antarctic Press (see Wild Life).

**MILK AND CHEESE**, by Evan Dorkin: They're a carton of hate and a wedge of spite. Fully armed with a tremendous arsenal of wisecracks and blunt instruments, they're shaking up America. Available from Slave Labor Graphics. For a free catalogue, call 1-800-866-8929.

**ANIMANIACS**: Manga parodies! Obscure R. Crumb references! Studio in-jokes! Who says toons are just for kids? Drawn by Leonardo Batic, Walter Carzon, and the best artist of all, Neal Sternecky (my personal hero and mentor).

**FLEA CIRCUS COMICS**: Contains Tom Ericksen's "Irrevelations" a tale of a futuristic Eau Claire, Rob Mattison's "Lockjaw", and "Tales From the Underground", not to mention a whole bunch of cartoons by yours truly. Get it at Eau Claire Comics.

**BONE**, by Jeff Smith: You haven't read Bone? You've got to read Bone. (Track down issue no. 23, they printed my letter.) Available from : Cartoon Books, P.O. Box 16973, Columbus, OH 43216.
